

## The Holy Spirit and You

### A. The Promise of the Holy Spirit

#### 1) Old Testament

##### a) Spirit on prophets and kings but never remained.

- Spirit of the LORD came mightily upon him (Samson) and he rent him (the lion) as he would have rent a kid, and *he had* nothing in his hand. Jud 14:6
- Spirit of the LORD will come upon thee (Saul), & you shall prophesy with them. 1 Sam 10:6
- But the Spirit of the LORD departed from Saul. 1 Sam 16:14

##### b) Spirit in you was a promise of the future.

- And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes. Ezek 36:27
- I shall put my spirit in you, & ye shall live, & I shall place you in your own land. Ezek 37:14
- Note that the promise is to all believers.

#### 2) New Testament

##### a) Spirit in all believers.

- Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, that that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. Gal 3:13-14
- You are the temple of God, and the Spirit of God dwells in you. 1 Cor 3:16
- Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of His. Rom 8:9
- When you are born again, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in you (your spirit). John 14:16-17

##### b) Spirit on all believers is a promise to those who desire it.

- The disciples were born again when Jesus said, "Receive the Holy Ghost." John 20:22
- After being born again, the disciples are told to tarry in Jerusalem for the Promise of the Father **upon** them to be endued with power from on high. Luke 24:49
- The Promise is to receive power when the Holy Ghost has come upon you. Acts 1:4-8.
- Your heavenly Father shall give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him. Luke 11:13

### B. The Holy Spirit in You

#### 1) The Holy Spirit in Jesus.

- a) Jesus is God so the Spirit of God must be in Him John 10:30
- b) John the Baptist was filled with the Holy Spirit from birth; so also must be Jesus. Luke 1:15
- c) The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; but the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of truth. John 1:14  
John 14:17
- d) God has given His Spirit without measure to Jesus. John 3:34

#### 2) The Holy Spirit in You.

- a) Know you not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you? 1 Cor 6:19
- b) He will never leave you nor forsake you. Heb 13:5
- c) The same Spirit Who raised Christ from the dead dwells in you. Rom 8:11
- d) Hidden mystery is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Col 1:26,27

#### 3) Why the Holy Spirit is in You.

- a) He shall teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that Jesus has said. John 14:26
- b) He will show you things to come. John 16:13
- c) He will help you to mature in the Fruit of the Spirit. Gal 5:22-23
- d) He will guide you into the blessings of God, including health, provision, protection. John 16:15

### C. The Holy Spirit on You

- 1) The Holy Spirit on Jesus.
  - a) The Messiah is He upon Whom you see the Spirit descending and **remaining**. John 1:33
  - b) Jesus was baptized in water & also baptized with (i.e., received) the Holy Ghost. Luke 3:21-23
  - c) The Spirit of the Lord is upon Him to preach the Gospel with signs and wonders. Luke 4:18
  - d) God anointed Jesus with the Holy Ghost and power to do good and to heal. Acts 10:38
- 2) The Holy Spirit on You.
  - a) On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit fell on all of the disciples. Acts 2:1-4
  - b) Have you received the Holy Ghost since you believed? Acts 19:1-6
  - c) Hands laid on believers and all received the Holy Ghost (HG). Acts 8:14-18
  - d) Born-again believers who had not yet received the HG and water baptism. Act 10:44-47
- 3) Why the Holy Spirit is on You.
  - a) He gives you power in your prayers (Acts 1:8) to do the things which Jesus did. John 14:12
  - b) He gives you the Gifts of the Spirit to walk in miracles, signs and wonders. 1Cor 12:4-11
  - c) He gives you boldness for ministry. Acts 4:29
  - d) He gives you the ability to pray in Tongues (7 different types). Eph 6:18

### D. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit

- 1) Who Should Receive the Holy Spirit?
  - a) Jesus came to baptize us with the Holy Ghost and with fire (Matt 3:11). Mark 1:8
  - b) All believers should receive the Holy Spirit. John 7:37-39
  - c) You can be a believer and not be filled with the Holy Ghost. Acts 19:2-6
  - d) You can be water baptized and not be filled with the Holy Ghost. Acts 8:12
- 2) How You Receive the Holy Spirit.
  - a) You can receive the Holy Spirit when you ask in faith (Mk 11:24). Luke 11:9-13
  - b) You can receive the Holy Ghost with prayer and the laying on of hands. Acts 8:17-18
  - c) You can receive the Holy Ghost in a miraculous manner. Acts 2:1-4
- 3) How You Know When You Have Received the Holy Spirit.
  - a) They spoke in tongues when they received the Holy Spirit. Acts 19:6
  - b) They knew that they were filled because of hearing them speak in tongues. Act 10:45-46
- 4) Tongues
  - a) Who should speak in Tongues?
    - All believers should speak in tongues. Mark 16:17; 1 Cor 14:5
    - Paul prayed in tongues more than anyone in the church at Corinth. 1 Cor 14:18
    - Do not forbid others to speak in an unknown language. 1 Cor 14:39
  - b) Why speak in Tongues?
    - When you pray in unknown tongues, you speak to God. 1 Cor 14:2
    - Speaking in tongues strengthens you spiritually. Jude 1:20; 1 Cor 14:4
    - Tongues help in intercessory prayer when you don't know how to pray. Rom 8:26
    - Tongues allow you to pray the mysteries of God above your understanding. 1 Cor 4:1; 14:2
    - Allow you to speak a known language which in the natural you do not know. Acts 2:6
    - Allow you to give orders to angels in the language of angels. Ps 103:20; 1 Cor 13:1
    - Allow you to sing praises in the spirit, without your understanding. 1 Cor 14:15
    - Allow you, with interpretations, to prophesy or teach. 1 Cor 14:5-6
    - **Most of all**, tongues allow you to turn your tongue (voice) over to the Holy Spirit. Ps 19:14
