

## Overview of Baptisms

**Overview:** The fullness of salvation comes when the goodness of God in our spirits flows throughout our entire being, manifesting in our bodies.

### A. Jesus Came for Your Salvation

1. What
  - a. Soteria (Strong's 4991). Acts 4:12
  - b. Deliverance from satan, sin, self, sickness and scarcity (Names of God).
  - c. Deliverance, Preservation, Guidance, Protection, Abundance.
  - d. Salvation of spirit. Rom 10:9,10
  - e. Salvation of soul. James 1:21
  - f. Salvation of body. Mark 16:16
2. How Luke 4:18
  - a. To preach Gospel to the poor: **Spirits filled with God.**
  - b. To heal the broken hearted: **Hearts clean and undivided.**
  - c. To preach deliverance to the captives: **Souls freed from snares.**
  - d. To preach recovery of sight to blind: **Minds living by faith, not sight.**
  - e. To set at liberty them that are bruised: **Bodies made whole.**

### B. Baptism Is the Doorway to Salvation

1. Spirit born again: Baptism into Jesus. John 3:7; Rom 10:9
2. Heart made clean and purified: Baptism into Christ. Acts 15:9; Eph 3:17; 5:26
3. Soul is restored: Baptism by fire. Psa 23:3; Matt 3:11,12
4. Mind is renewed: Baptism of the H.S. Rom 12:2; John 1:32, 33
5. Body dead to sin: Baptism with water. Rom 6:11

### C. Salvation Is Received by Believing and Acting

1. Heart: Baptism into the Word, Christ as Lord.
2. Soul: Baptism into the fire of consecration.
3. New creation: Baptism into Jesus as Savior.
4. Mind submitted to the Spirit: Baptism of the H.S. to see by faith, not by sight.
5. Body buried into the death of Jesus: Baptism with water to reckon yourself dead to sin.
